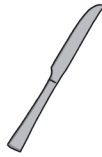

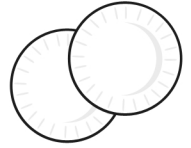
# Christmas Craft Instructions

## Snowflake Printing

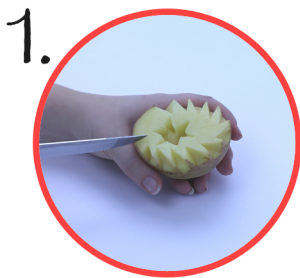


### You will need...

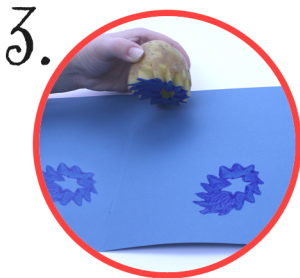
Potatoes (cut in half)  
White, light blue and silver paint  
Dark blue or black A3 paper  
Plates or trays for paint  
Small spoon  
Melon baller  
Round tipped knife  
Glitter



### What you do...

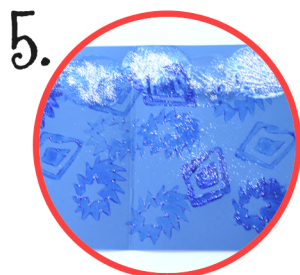
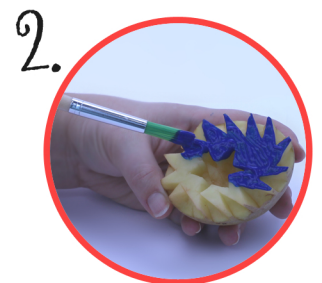


1. Prepare the potatoes by cutting in half and using the flat edge to scoop out or cut out parts to create patterns. Use the melon baller to scoop out the middle and the knife to cut out patterns.

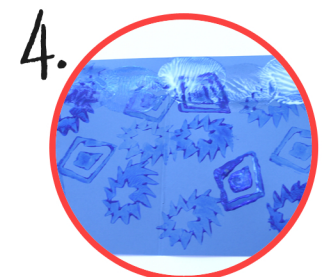


3. Cover the patterns on the potatoes in paint, making sure there is plenty on.

Press the potatoes on the paper to make snowflake patterns.



5. Use a plain potato without any patterns to make clouds at the top of the picture, or use a paint brush to paint in roof tops or snowy hills at the bottom of the page.



Use sprinkles of glitter on some of the snowflake prints to add some sparkle to the snow storm.
