WOW is Living Streets' walk to school challenge. Pupils log their daily journeys to school on the WOW Travel Tracker. Those who walk, wheel, cycle or scoot to school at least once a week earn a WOW badge, with a new one to collect each month. It's as easy as that. WOW successfully reduces congestion outside schools, helping to tackle road danger and air pollution – all whilst children benefit mentally and physically from being more active. **livingstreets.org.uk/WOW**
